#### Reliability

Consumer-member outage data is thoroughly reviewed by our employees to identify and update electric lines and equipment most susceptible to failure from weather, trees, age and other factors that increase the likelihood of future outages and other power reliability concerns. Enhancements in

2022 included the replacement of 435 poles, the rebuild of 4 miles of electric distribution line, 42 new service builds and 59 service updates.

We are always looking at ways to enhance our system's reliability. We utilize total minutes off per meter to analyze how we are doing. The USDA Rural Utility Service reliability guidelines recommend outage times of less than 200 minutes per meter per year. We are proud to say in 2022 Flint Hills REC was at 96 minutes per meter per year. It is important to understand that these numbers are used to determine the overall health of Flint Hills REC's electric distribution system, and these numbers exclude power supply outages, major events and scheduled outages. There are many factors that contribute to this success such as the efforts of our employees to maintain and update our system, response time to outages, tree trimming and pole inspections, to name a few.

#### **Financial Update**

Operating margins were minimal over the past three years, but

Member equity on Dec. 31, 2022, was \$20.8 million, or 52% of total assets. Approximately \$495,055 of capital credits were paid to the membership in 2022, with an additional \$489,000 approved for payment in 2023.

> the cooperative's balance sheet remains strong.

To improve operating margins, Flint Hills REC completed a study of the coop's cost of providing electric service and our rates. It was determined that annual electric revenues need to be increased by \$934,000, or 7.7%, to cover increased expenses for building, maintaining, and upgrading the electric distribution facilities, wages and benefits, inflation, and the overall cost of doing business.

# **Students Invited to Apply** for Leadership Opportunities

Students will join youth from across the nation in Washington, D.C. They will see the monuments and other attractions, as well as visit Capitol Hill to learn more about how our government works. Those selected for this experience also can apply for the Kansas seat on a national youth leadership council.

### Cooperative Youth Leadership Camp — July 14-20, 2023

Held near Steamboat Springs, Colorado, high school students from electric cooperative communities in Colorado, Kansas, Oklahoma and Wyoming participate in this leadership camp. Together, they will create a candy cooperative, hear from dynamic speakers, and raft down the Colorado River.
